## THE PILGRIMAGE IN THE MIDDLE- AGES

The fame of St. James' tomb spread across Western Europe and it became a place of pilgrimage, comparable with Jerusalem and Rome. By the beginning of the 10th century, pilgrims were coming to Spain on the French routes from Tours, Limoges, and Le Puy, and facilities for their bodily and spiritual welfare began to appear along the formal pilgrimage route. Meanwhile, in Compostela itself a magnificent new basilica was built to house the relics of the apostle, along with other installations - churches, chapels, hospices, and hospitals. The 12th century saw the route achieve its greatest influence, used by thousands of pilgrims from all over Western Europe.
